

Meetings

Meetings are free and are generally held on the second Friday evening of each month, September to June. Meetings provide an opportunity to keep up to date with society business as well as to socialize with others interested in the calligraphic arts.

The Friday evening programs are varied and can include slide presentations, hands-on projects, demonstrations, and a sharing of information, tools and techniques. Our meetings feature local and out-of-town guest speakers.

Exhibitions

An exhibition of members' work is held every other year, with a reception for members and guests. Usually there is great variety in the calligraphic techniques displayed. The event is open to all members who desire to submit entries, and all levels are encouraged to participate. The exhibition provides a wonderful opportunity for calligraphers to showcase their work to the general public.

Education

The SDFC educational program is designed to benefit all skill levels. We sponsor continuing education classes and weekend workshops taught by talented local as well as internationally recognized artists and calligraphers. The guest instructors often present the Friday evening program preceding their weekend workshop.

Membership

SDFC membership is open to all—amateur and professional—regardless of calligraphic skill. We encourage beginners to join us and welcome all members to participate in the various functions of the society.

Communications

Letter Perfect, the official newsletter of SDFC, is published bi-monthly and provides members with interesting articles, a listing of local classes and workshops, and helpful calligraphic information. The membership receives meeting notices as well as special bulletins via U.S. mail and/or electronic mail.
